Subject: Licence issued under the *Cannabis Act* and *Cannabis Regulations*

Dear Dr. Kung'u,

Thank you for submitting an application in the Cannabis Tracking and Licensing System (CTLS) for an Analytical Testing licence under the *Cannabis Act* and *Cannabis Regulations*.

Enclosed is a copy of your licence for Analytical Testing, issued under the *Cannabis Act*. This document contains your new licence number which should be included in all correspondence with Health Canada.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that with the issuance of this licence, you are required to abide by the requirements outlined in the *Cannabis Act* and *Cannabis Regulations* in the operation of your business. These documents are available at the links provided below:

We ask that you familiarize yourself with the Act and Regulations, as they outline the legal framework for controlling the production, distribution, sale, and possession of cannabis across Canada. In particular, please take note of the sections pertaining to your licence in Parts 2, 4, 8, 10, 11, and 12 of the *Cannabis Regulations*.

Please also note that it is the responsibility of the licence holder to be aware of, and compliant with all other federal, provincial, and municipal requirements.

Amendments

As per section 32 of the *Cannabis Regulations*, if you wish to make any changes to the name of the licence holder, the address of the site or buildings within the site where activities are authorized, or to the authorized activities at your site or at buildings within the site, you are required to seek an amendment to your Analytical Testing licence through CTLS. An amendment is also required to change or remove any condition on your licence. Sale and distribution

As an Analytical Testing licence holder, pursuant to subsection 25(1) of the *Cannabis Regulations*, you must destroy samples of cannabis of a lot or batch that have been distributed to you and cannabis obtained from those samples, within 90 days after completing the testing of the samples of the lot or batch. The samples whose analysis is not initiated within 120 days of their receipt must either be destroyed, or distributed to another holder of a cannabis analytical testing licence or to individuals referred to in section 4, as stipulated by subsection 25(2) of the *Cannabis Regulations*.

Transparency

Licence holders should note that their basic information will be published on the Health Canada website page related to analytical testing licences for cannabis; this page may be found at: <https://www.canada.ca/en/health-canada/services/list-licensed-dealers.html>. The format and information in this table may be updated periodically to align with the disclosure of licensing information in other Health Canada licensing programs, including drugs, medical devices, as well as cannabis cultivation, processing, and sale. Other licensing requirements

Canada Revenue Agency

Under the *Excise Act 2001*, all holders of a licence under the *Cannabis Act* who are authorized to cultivate, produce, and package cannabis are required to also hold a cannabis licence from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Holders of the cannabis Analytical Testing licence may be required to also hold a Drug Establishment Licence (DEL), as this requirement may apply to establishments that test drugs containing cannabis. Please contact us at the address provided at the end of this email to verify whether this requirement applies to your facility.

Research and Development activities

Should you decide to carry out research and development activities within the framework of your permitted activities with cannabis, we remind you that you must comply with section 237 of the *Cannabis Regulations*. This section outlines the record keeping requirements for the conduct of research and development activities.

Pesticide Testing Activities


A holder of a licence for analytical testing that is authorized to conduct pesticide testing should note that, as a condition on your licence, any pesticide testing activities conducted under the scope of Health Canada's *Mandatory cannabis testing for pesticide active ingredients – Requirements* must meet the requirements that are set out in that document.
